

Director's Note

I would like to take this opportunity, on behalf of our cast, our crew, and the Hubcity Theatre board, to welcome you to the Shakespeare in the Park production of Hamlet.

My peculiar obsession with Hamlet began years ago as an undergraduate (let's not mention the year), when my professor at the time, Dr. Ben Faber, teased the students at the tail end of a lecture with an astonishing theory of the play and in particular, Hamlet's madness. Since then I have not been able to let that Idea go, or rather, the Idea has not been willing to let go of me. Once I was conscious that the opportunity to direct was laid before me, I could not but help to be led unto temptation to put that Idea into Action.

Some explanations are in order, as I expect you will notice a few things awry from the usual Hamlet fare. But I fear those explanations may spoil the show, and I offer these three facets of the play to guide your attention instead:

- 1. Our play is set in modified modernity; yet the Ghost is Elizabethan.
- 2. The Ghost hands Hamlet a book; make a note of it's title. It should be familiar to you.
- 3. The curtains are supernatural.

That guidance being noted, I would like to express gratitude for those who have guided me to this opportunity. My teachers, both literary and theatrical, either through observation or under their direction: Dr. Ben Faber and Dr. Douglas Mantz, Ian Getty, Robin Oxley, Alex Jayner, Paul Power, Cody Bolton and James Corbett. These thanks extend much further to the cast and crew of Hamlet for both their considerable talents and their stores of patience with this first time director. In particular I would like to thank JB Vanier for keeping me focused and upbeat, and to Erin Lauriston for taking care of practically everything else! They both provided timely simple solutions to what appeared to me to be unsolvable problems. And of course, I must thank my partner Eve for her continual support of my own madness.

Thanks to all of you and I hope you enjoy our show.

The Argument of the Play

The recent sadness over the passing of Old King Hamlet has begun to fade with the crowning of his brother, Claudius as king of Denmark, not to mention his joyful marriage with Queen Gertrude, the poor widow of the Old King. The marriage is welcomed by all in Denmark but for Hamlet, Gertrude and the old King Hamlet's sole child. Understandably, the prince is upset by the hasty marriage of his mother to his father's brother.

Although it appears that Hamlet will simply remain in Elsinore under the watchful eye of Gertrude and Claudius; something is rotten in the state of Denmark. A Ghost has appeared in the environs of Elsinore, bearing a resemblance to Hamlet's Father, the Old King, his Creator. The Ghost imparts an astonishing revelation, as well as a terrible burden AND an insight into *Hamlet*'s true nature.


